# GEOLOGY

| 3 *    | Alfred Wegener first proposed the idea of drifting continents. Write a brief biography of Alfred Wegener. For an extra star draw a series of diagrams to show how one large landmass gradually became the continents seen today.   |                             |
| 4 *    | Collect 5 different rocks and write a brief description of each stating colour, texture, where found and if possible classify them as igneous, sedimentary or metamorphic. For an extra star display in a box you have made.   |                             |
| 5 ***  | Explain what the Mohs scale of hardness is and how it is used. Design a hardness tester and use it to rank 5 different materials in order of hardness eg wood, glass, plastic etc.   |                             |
| 9 **   | New Zealand is famous for its thermal areas around Rotorua. Design and illustrate a simple publicity brochure to tell tourists what kinds of things they will see such as geysers or boiling mud, and what causes them.  |                             |
| 15 **  | Find out how coal, oil or gas are found in NZ. Include diagrams in your explanation. What makes the conditions in a coal mine dangerous? Draw a map of NZ showing areas where each of the above can be found. Include on your map where the Oil Refinery in NZ is located. |                             |
