8	**	Produce a leaflet to use to identify different birds in your neighbourhood. State why each of the introduced birds was brought to Aotearoa-NZ by Pakeha. Was it by accident, to remind people of where they once lived, or to catch insects or something else?	
11	**	Make or draw a food web and explain how the introduction of a new species, such as a predator or competitor, changes the food web..	
17	**	Draw a design for a surveillance insect trap. Explain how it works. Should you touch one if you see them? Design a warning sign for your trap. ** BONUS 2 stars if you build/make the trap you have designed.	
24	**	Research the use of dogs in biosecurity work. Why are beagles the most commonly used breed? Where would be the best places in Aotearoa-NZ to put them? Explain what hazards they are trained to detect.	

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
